

They also visited the Center for Biodiversity Conservation of the Adriatic – Aquarium Boka, part of the Institute of Marine Biology.

After some relaxation and enjoyment in Budva, the university employees visited Tivat and Porto Montenegro, where they took a walk in the former JNA harbor, which transformed into a beautiful resort in 2009.

After a pleasant atmosphere and socializing in the stunning surroundings, the university employees returned to Mostar, ready for new work achievements and successes!

### Motivation Lecture by Professor Liliana Hawrysz

As part of the Erasmus project for academic exchange of teaching and nonteaching staff, Professor Liliana Hawrysz from Wroclaw, Poland, visited the Faculty of Economics at the University "Džemal Bijedić" to deliver a lecture to fourth-year students on the topic of motivation and employee motivational strategies. The guest professor was warmly welcomed by the Vice Dean for Scientific Research, Professor Sanvila Vuk, and Assistant Lejla Škaljić.

Professor Hawrysz is a member of the Management Department at the Faculty of Economics in Wroclaw, where she focuses on research on employee motivation and organizational behavior. In her lecture, the professor shared her knowledge about various motivational theories, emphasizing their practical application in the real world, with a special focus on concrete examples from the Polish context. After the presentation, students had the opportunity to ask Professor Hawrysz questions, which resulted in a discussion and additional insights on the topic.

### Lecture by Professor Ksymena Rosiek
