The tournament was opened for participation to all students of the University.



As part of the celebration of the 47th anniversary of the University, in the presence of many guests a reconstructed gym "Sport and Health" was opened today at the Faculty of Education.

Apart from the Faculty of Education and Dzemal Bijedic University of Mostar, the Ministry of Civil Affairs of Bosnia and Herzegovina, the Federal Ministry of Culture and Sports, the Government of the Herzegovina Neretva Canton, and the City of Mostar helped with the reconstruction and furnishing of the gym. prof. dr. Ekrem Čolakhodžić emphasized that opening the gym was just one step towards the implementation of the vision of the Faculty of Education. Students will now have much better study conditions. The newly opened facility is designed as a place for gathering students and their extracurricular activities.

"We are happy that we have brought the project to an end, and even happier that we will not stop there but continue to invest in the infrastructure, thus providing students and teaching staff with better working conditions," said the dean, prof. dr. Ekrem Čolakhodžić.

The University is the bearer of social development of the City of Mostar and Herzegovina, and the campus was and still is a gathering place for young people, a place for sports competitions and the acquisition of new knowledge and skills.

Solemn session of the University Senate

Celebration of 47 years of foundation of Dzemal Bijedic University of Mostar University continued with the solemn session of the Senate at the Centre for Culture in Mostar. Apart from the university management, deans, heads of university studies, the ceremony was attended by the rectors of public universities in Bosnia and Herzegovina, numerous dignitaries, officials, and guests. The Senate session included the presentation a scroll of honour for the efforts and exceptional contribution to the development of the University and the recognition of the University reputation in the country and abroad as well as of the presentation of the Rector's awards to the best students.

Prof. dr. Alena Huseinbegović, the Rector of the Dzemal Bijedic University of Mostar emphasized that these events are an opportunity to summarize the results of the previous academic year and to announce future plans.

"In the current year, the University had a 12 percent increase in the number of enrolled students compared to the previous year. There are also six new study programs University will offer for the next academic year, as well as various forms of lifelong learning with the intention of connecting the labor market and education to increase the higher employment rate of our students and their adequate response to the challenges of modern times," she the Rector.

The Rector also reminded the audience about the University's investment in the infrastructure, primarily, the newly opened, modernly equipped Student Dormitory Antalya, which includes a student clinic with primary health care. Then, a sports hall at the Faculty of Education, the plan to build sports fields within the University campus, as well as activities on the reconstruction of the so-called common building used by several faculties, which represents a kind of symbol of the University from the war and post-war development of the Dzemal Bijedic

Prof. dr. Nermina Hadžigrahić, the Rector of the University of Tuzla and the chairperson of the Rector's Conference of Bosnia and Herzegovina, said that through five decades of its existence, the Dzemal Bijedic University of Mostar Mostar has developed into a respectable higher education institution.

"We in the Rector's Conference are also proud of every success of the University, because it is the success of each of us," said prof. dr. Hadžigrahić.

Minister of Education, Science, Culture and Sports of Herzegovina-Neretva Canton prof. dr. Adnan Velagić emphasized the importance of this day both for the University and for the wider community.

"The university represents the backbone of future development in our canton. The Ministry will continue with the support that will go in several directions. Our support will also imply finances to raise the standards of professors and students," said Minister Velagić.

Prof. dr. Sead Pašić, former Rector of the University received the honorary title of professor emeritus.

Promotion of publishing activities

On 15.2.2024, Džemal Bijedić University of Mostar promoted its publishing activities for 2023. The University published the Bibliography of Doctoral Dissertations of the Džemal Bijedić University of Mostar: 1997 - 2023, by Jasminka Trešnjo, and the Bibliography of Monograph Publications of the University Džemal Bijedić University of Mostar: 1977 - 1991, Volume 1, by Edita Mulaosmanović.

The Faculty of Economics released a new edition of Collection of Papers, a magazine that has been published since 2000. Three monographs were published at the Faculty of Humanities: Pictures of the Orient in Travelogues by the German-speaking author, Sandine Herić; Romance Gardens of Dževad Karahasan by Dijana Hadžizukič, and Sinan-pasha Borovinić: Social Status, Origin, Political Rise, Beginning of Urbanization of Mostar by Adis Zilić, Faruk Taslidža, and others. Additionally, two serial publications were released: Research and Herzegovina.

Emir Nezirić, assistant professor at the Faculty of Mechanical Engineering, published a monograph Technical Mechanics - Kinematics.

The Faculty of Law unveiled new editions of three serial publications: Days of Family Law, Yearbook of the Faculty of Law, and Review of Law and Economics.

The Faculty of Civil Engineering introduced three textbooks: Concrete Constructions - Part 1 (3rd expanded edition), Concrete Constructions - Part 2, and Concrete Constructions: A Collection of Completed Assignments by Prof. Dr. Armin Hadrović. The Faculty of Education released new editions of Educa and Sports Logos magazines.

The University archives all its publications in the Archive Collection of the University Library. Thus far, the University has published about 400 monographs, while 2,164 scientific and professional papers and reports have been published in 9 regularly issued journals.

Promotion scientific and research projects



On 15.2.2024, the University has also promoted scientific and research and inter-university projects. In total, 10 projects were presented. Prof. dr. Denisa Žujo Zekić presented the project Framework program draft of environmental management and guidelines for biodiversity protection of the university campus in Northern camp/Džemal Bijedić University of Mostar. Assistant professor Emir Nezirić presented the project "Organization of lifelong learning program "Sustainable energy and innovations" to promote new technologies based on RES. Assistant professor Damir Špago presented the project Increasing the energy efficiency of the heating system using solar thermal collectors. Senior teaching assistant Aleksandra Šupljeglav Jukić presented the project Research of innovative methods of soil phytoremediation at the experimental training ground of the Faculty of Agriculture. Assistant professor Jasna Hasanbegović Sejfić presented the project Researching the agritourism offer of Bosnia and Herzegovina and the possibility of linking it into a closed system of offering products, services, and promotion. Assistant professor. Marko Ćećez presented the projects Application of waste marble powder as a substitute for cement to produce sustainable concrete and Preparation of the Smarteem project proposal for Horizon Europe cluster 5: energy. Salko Kovačić presented the project Promotion and strengthening of the participation of Bosnia and Herzegovina partners in Horizon Europe cluster 4: digital. Prof. dr. Aida Šukalić presented the project Analysis of the content of heavy metals in cabbage (brassica oleracea var. acephala) with an assessment of environmental risk and risk to human health. Prof. dr. Nerma Čolaković Prguda presented the project Rural tourism as a function of local economic development in FBiH. Prof. dr. Rijad Novaković presented the project Determining the state of obesity of high school students in Herzegovina Neretva Canton.

In total, 10 projects were presented.

Promotion of 493 graduates



The pinnacle of the celebration of the 47th anniversary of the Dzemal Bijedic University of Mostar was the promotion and awarding of diplomas to 493 graduates who completed their University studies on 17.2.2024, i.e., 367 first cycle studies graduates and 126 second cycle studies graduates, in addition to 5 doctoral graduates.
