With the arrival of summer days, most people think about going to the swimming pools to cool off and ease the summer heat to some extent. Although most people prefer the swimming pools or the seaside, there are some interested in exotic destinations and locations. Those who want to try something new do not have to go far. Waterfalls Kravica in Bosnia and Herzegovina are among one the most beautiful beaches in the world. Time Out magazine has included Kravica waterfall in 12th place on their list of 15 of the most spectacular places to swim in the world. The Kravica waterfall is located on the 50 km long course of the Trebižat river in Studenci near Ljubuški. It was created in the area where the Trebižat River splits, creating a magnificent 30 meters high waterfall.

Crystal clear and turquoise water surrounded by greenery forms a water amphitheater with a diameter of 120 meters with a natural pool. In the summer period, due to the lower water level of the river, tourists can not only swim in the pool under the falls but also enjoy different water sports. This oasis in stone attracts around 200 thousand tourists a year.

The Sredena areas around the Kravica waterfall the geological is natural monument of Bosnia and Herzegovina. In the past, numerous mills, and stupas for rolling cloth were active by the waterfall. Today these stone mills mostly stand by the river as a reminder of some ancient times, and few of them are still in operation. The experience of visiting the Kravica waterfall is completed by a nearby small cave, open on both sides with stalactites made of calcium carbonate, an old mill, and a boat. Kravica is one of the most beautiful natural beauties in Herzegovina in general.



GitHub Copilot is an AI pair programmer that helps you write code faster and with less work, something like an auto-complete function. It is powered by OpenAI Codex. It sends your comments and code to the GitHub Copilot service, which then uses OpenAI Codex to synthesize and suggest individual lines and whole functions. It's hard to believe how far coding has come, and everybody super excited to see how far it can go.



Srebrenica

The Bosnian Institute in the United Kingdom has published a list of 296 villages destroyed around Srebrenica three years before the genocide. In the first three months of war (April-June 1992). 296 predominantly Bosniak (Bosnian Muslim) villages in the region around Srebrenica were destroyed. Some 70,000 Bosniaks were forced to leave their homes while at least 3,166 Bosniaks (documented deaths) including many women, children and the elderly were killed.

Students Union of Dzemal Bijedic University of Mostar organized the visit to the Srebrenica memorial centre in Potočari. The students of the Dzemal Bijedic University of Mostar, members of the Info service for youth and citizens of the City of Mostar visited the memorial centre in Potočari to mark the 27th anniversary of the Srebrenica genocide.

The Srebrenica massacre is considered as the worst episode of mass murder within Europe since World War II. More than eight thousand unarmed Bosniaks aged 14 to 70 were killed from July 11 to 19, 1995. More than six hundred children were killed. The youngest victim was born on July 13, 1995, and it was exhumed from a mass grave near Srebrenica in 2012.



The European Youth Card

The European Youth Card is a digital card that can be accessed through the "European Youth Card" application.

The card can be ordered simply by filling out the online form and within 48 hours a student will receive an e-mail with a special code and instructions how to activate the card.

The card is valid for one year.

The card can be used in Bosnia and Herzegovina, but also in 37 European countries.

Tens of thousands of discounts on travel, cultural events, accommodation, education, services, and products in 37 countries across Europe are available through this card. In addition, there are hundreds of programs and opportunities in each country for volunteering, learning, employment, entrepreneurship, and many other things to help students.


The card is issued and managed by organizations that are members of the European Youth Card Association (EYCA).
