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#### International Day of Education

The 24th of January was proclaimed as the International Day of Education by the Resolution of the United Nations General Assembly on the 3rd of December 2018. The Resolution, adopted by consensus, celebrated the role of education in peace and development.

#### The history of stone as building material

As a part of the regular activities of the course Engineering Geology, bachelor students in the first year of studies of the Faculty of Civil Engineering went on a field class with prof. Toni Nikolic to experience the engineering aspect of engineering geology in the City of Mostar. The first location was the construction works on the roundabout near the bus station, then they had the opportunity to examine the stone-built buildings, old buildings without reinforcements. A fountain and a monument built of travertine stone "Plivita", old sacral buildings built of the famous limestone stone "Tenelija", such as Karadoz Bey Mosque, Old Catholic church, The Old Bridge, and others, as well as numerous facades made of decorative granite stone in The Fejića street. At the Bunur pedestrian bridge, they had the opportunity to see the fluvioglacial Mostar conglomerate, which was deposited in the entire valley of Mostar and on which almost all the buildings of the city are based, except for those that gravitate towards Hum or Velez, which were built directly on the limestone bedrock. The old bridge was certainly specially described and explained, from the method of construction with tenelli, pouring molten lead as reinforcement to the use of terra rossa (red soil) as a natural waterproofing under the limestone pedestrian cover that is isolated from the penetration of water to the tenelli which is the base of the bridge.

### "Quality Days" at Dzemal Bijedic University of Mostar By IROUNMO



The "Days of Quality" at the Dzemal Bijedic University of Mostar were opened with its first workshop on Monday, the 16th of January.

The workshop 'Quality Assurance and Accreditation' was held in the moot courtroom at the Faculty of Law. The lecturer was the Secretary General of the Džemal Bijedić University of Mostar and the Quality Assurance and ECTS Officer, Alim Abazovic.

Secretary General spoke about self-evaluation criteria, the university accreditation process, and the role and importance of Commissions and the Accreditation Agency. In addition, mr. Abazovic spoke about ensuring the quality of teaching at the Dzemal Bijedic University of Mostar.

'The role of students in the higher education system' was the second workshop held on the same day. The lecturers were: the Secretary General of the Dzemal Bijedic University of Mostar, and the Quality Assurance and ECTS Officer, Alim Abazovic and the President of the Student Union of the Dzemal Bijedic University of Mostar, Kenan Begovic.

They talked about quality assurance, student participation in management processes, passive and active approaches to studying, involvement of students in the work of the Senate of the Dzemal Bijedic University of Mostar, teaching and scientific councils at Faculties and University study programmes, participation in the work of commissions, etc.

The target groups of the workshops were the staff, employees, and students of the Dzemal Bijedic University of Mostar.

### Field trip of students of University study programme of Tourism to Jablanica By IROUNMO



Link Association and the Dzemal Bijedic University of Mostar are intensively working to provide better practice examples for young people, and students of the University. The aim is to introduce the students to good practices and show them valuable lessons in the field, through direct communication with businessmen from different sectors, the LINK Association announced. One of the numerous presentations, meetings, and study visits organized was a visit to Jablanica, carried out in cooperation with the University Study Programme of Tourism.

The Women's Association "Most" who decided to launch the first social enterprise in Jablanica recognized the tourist potential of this region. Women's Association "Most" gathers women from the Jablanica rural areas and promotes the traditional production and cultural identity of Bosnia and Herzegovina, particularly Jablanica. Women, members of the Association, are engaged in the production of traditional food, preservation, and promotion of Bosnian cuisine, costumes, culture, and songs. Guided by the vision of maintaining the tradition and using the tourist potential while empowering women in society, the members of the Association decided to establish Most M d.o.o. - the first social enterprise in Jablanica. The students heard their stories and tasted some of the traditional Bosnian dishes. 'Social entrepreneurship represents a relatively new form of business, which can apply to all legal forms of business entities - cooperatives, citizens' associations, protective workshops, business incubators, and limited liability companies. The idea is to invest the profit earned in development such as employment of people who have difficulty finding work, education, environmental protection, cultural activities in the community, etc. Social entrepreneurship is very important from the aspect of solving social problems such as exclusion, poverty, unemployment, all with the application of innovative methods.

### The student campaign "Remember..." reflects the memory of Dzemal Bijedic



The legacy of Dzemal Bijedic, born in Mostar, is still alive through the University that bears his name. Nowadays, we all know who Džemal Bijedić was. We remember the 18th of January 1977, when the entire former Yugoslavia and the wider public were shaken by the sad news of the passing of Džemal Bijedić. On the flight from Belgrade to Sarajevo, the plane crashed and the then president of the then Federal Executive Council Dzemal Bijedic, his wife Razija, and crew members all lost their lives. The university founded in 1977, the very same year that Dzemal Bijedic died, and Mostar commemorate the anniversary of his death every year.

46 years after the death of the great persons from Mostar and a man of the people, the students of the Faculty of Economics from Stolac, Mostar, Jablanica, Bugojno, and Velika Kladusa, five different cities of Bosnia and Herzegovina, have honoured the legacy of Dzemal Bijedic. They designed and implemented a campaign to remember his name within 'Marketing' the course they study at the Faculty. The campaign called "Remember..." was carried out in cooperation with the Hercegovina Museum Mostar. The Dzemal Bijedic's birthplace, a part of the Museum, transformed into his memorial house since April 1981. As a sign of support to their work, the students were invited to the round table 'The role of Dzemal Bijedic in the socio-political processes of the 20th century' on the 46th anniversary of Dzemal Bijedic's death.
