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Tips for incomings: Transportation

Mostar is a small city located two hours away from Sarajevo, so if you are interested in coming to the "Dzemal Bijedic" University of Mostar, it could be useful for you to read this article.

The best option is to fly to Sarajevo airport and here are some recommendations. At the airport you can take a taxi to the central bus station. It is located around 20 minutes away from the airport. Arriving there you have two options: taking a train or a bus. But if you want to enjoy the view, you should definitely take the train.

If your city does not have connections to Sarajevo, the next suitable option is Dubrovnik or even Split. The Croatian cities are as well located two hours away from Mostar. From there you can come by the bus, but don't be surprise if the connections are not as frequent as from Sarajevo.

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
