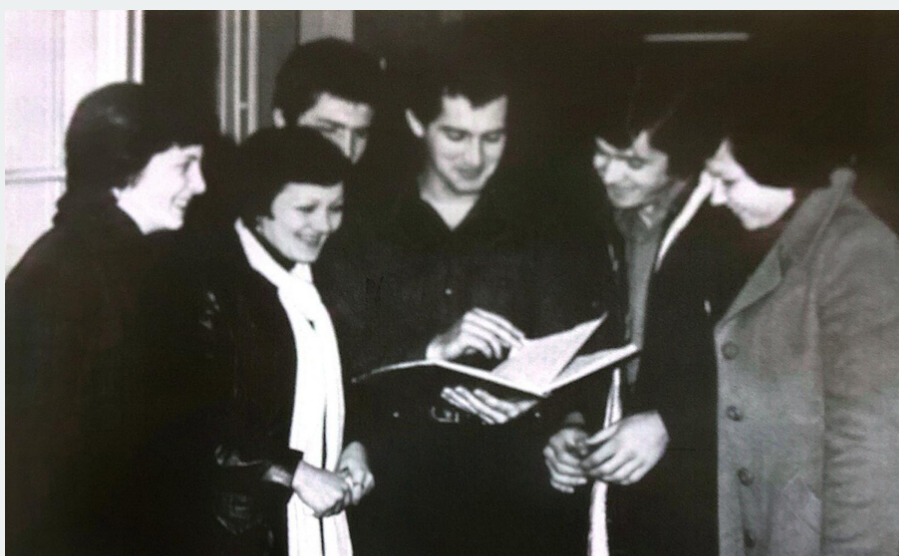
University mission

The Džemal Bijedić University of Mostar is located in the city, which is the birthplace of giants such as Šantić, Humo, Matvejević, Ćorović, and where Kranjčević got his education. They obligate us to continue the tradition of the culture of academic education.

Mostar has always been a crossroads of cultures, a place where the East embraced the West. Predestined for progress due to its location, Mostar very quickly became the bearer of the development of Herzegovina, of progressive ideas that developed together with the city and allowed education to grow as well. Thus, in 1893, was founded one of the oldest Grammar schools in Bosnia and Herzegovina. In 1950, Mostar became home to the Higher Pedagogical School.

Faculties



Agro-Mediterranean Faculty

Agro-Mediterranean Faculty started working in the 1997/1998 academic year, as a member of Dzemal Bijedic University of Mostar. It was founded out of need for young experts who would, in agro-ecological conditions in sub-Mediterranean part of Bosnia&Herzegovina, develop production of specific fruits, wine, vegetables and flowers.



Faculty of Economics

The Faculty of Economics of Dzemal Bijedic University of Mostar was founded in 1976. Its primary mission is education and training of high-quality professionals who can meet requirements set by modern businesses; scientific and research work at the state level, but also in the regional and international context, as well as cooperation with scientific institutions, government and non-government institutions and economy.



Faculty of Humanities

Faculty of Humanities was founded in 1999, as a member of Dzemal Bijedic University of Mostar. Today it is placed in the University campus in Mostar. A new faculty building was built in 2011, with modern classrooms, laboratories and equipment.



Faculty of Education

Faculty of Education was founded in 1950. Students from all parts of Bosnia-Herzegovina and from the neighboring countries study at the Teacher-Training Faculty. In addition to 45 full-time employees, around 50 professors work at the Faculty, including associates from the Universities of Sarajevo, Tuzla, Banja Luka, Bihać, Belgrade, among which are well-known names in the higher education of the ex-Yugoslavia region.



Law Faculty

Law Faculty was founded in 1976. The Faculty organizes and performs a teaching process for the 1st and 2nd cycle, in line with Bologna principles. The Faculty is well equipped. University studies



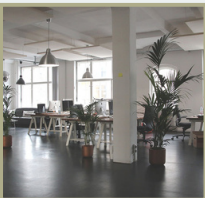
Business Informatics

Health care

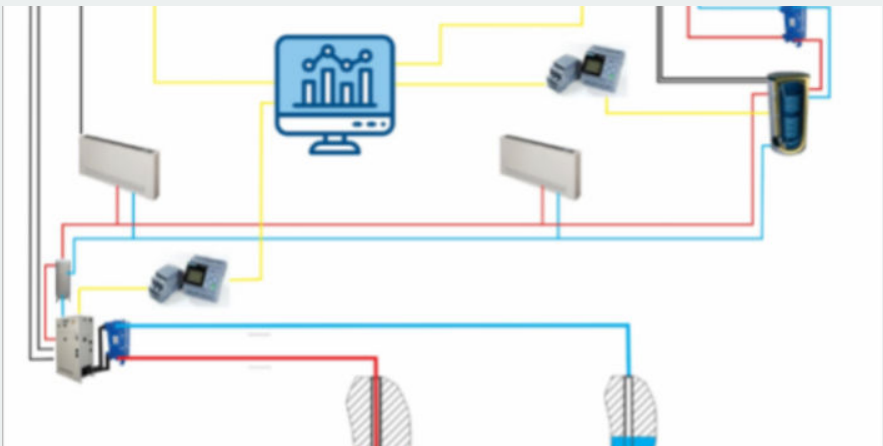
Recent Research

Optimizing Energy

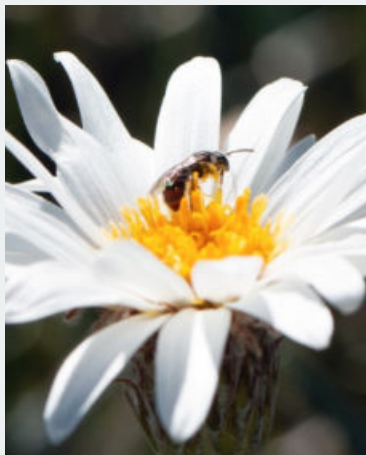


Assist. Prof. Damir Špago researched the possibility of switching classic energy consumers such as colleges to the prosumer type with the simultaneous production of electricity and thermal energy from renewable energy sources in his doctoral thesis.

For this purpose, a two-stage optimization model was developed from economic, environmental and energy aspects. In addition to monitoring the real potential of RES for the Herzegovina area, the research also included the operating parameters of such a hybrid system.



“BeeGood”



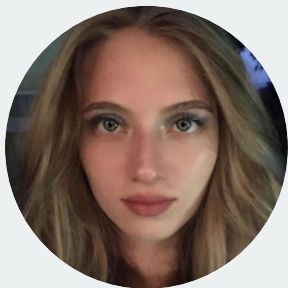
Large-scale environmental monitoring programs rely on costly sampling of many media (air, water, soil, etc.) from a large network of sampling stations. Honeybees and their products have been shown to be excellent biomonitors due to their capacity to accumulate pollutants from the air, soil, and water within a specific radius during their foraging trips.

Recent field tries in Serbia show that they can indeed offer this service at much lower cost than conventional methods.

The 2-year project has been jointly developed between dr. Nils Haneklaus from University for Continuing Education in Krems, Austria and prof. Maja Kazazic from Dzemal Bijedic University of Mostar (UNMO), Bosnia and Herzegovina and is implemented collaboratively from 1st of January 2023 to 31st of December 2024. MA Emina Mehic and dr. Liliya Satalkina are also included in the implementation of the project.

The results of this mobility funding will lead to at least one joint peer reviewed publication submitted. At the same time, we hope that the results of the project will provide a solid foundation for larger follow-up applications. If using honeybees for biomonitoring does indeed prove promising, application will be done for follow-up funding in basic- and applied sciences.

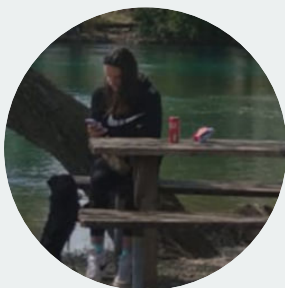
Offer for Incoming Students

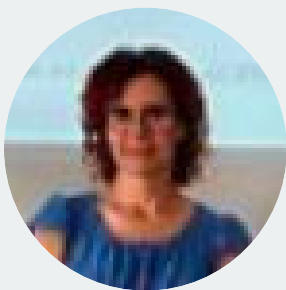

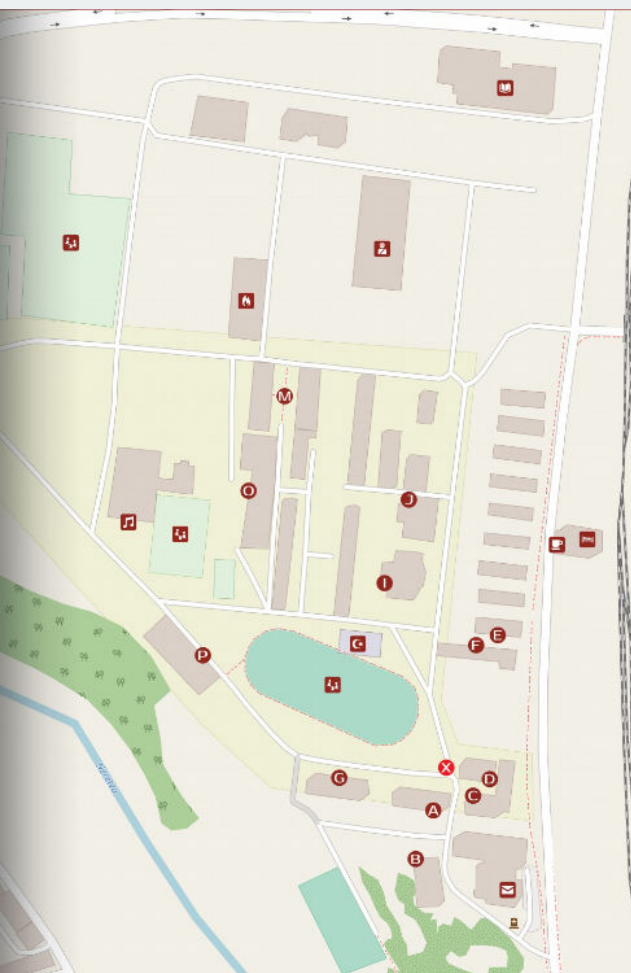
