The United Nations declared December 5th as the INTERNATIONAL DAY OF VOLUNTEERS in 1985.

On this occasion, we present an interview with a young woman who, at the end of elementary school, earned the title of School Pride; at the end of high school, the title of Student of the Year; and completed the first cycle of Business Informatics Studies with an average grade of 10.0 – Sara Kljajić.

Can you briefly introduce yourself?

My name is Sara Kljajić, and I am 21 years old. The meaning of my name is twofold: desert and princess. I often mention this to people when I want to describe my character more closely. The two personalities of minimalism and perfectionism clash within me, but they find a way to coexist. That's why I almost always chose two-way relationships that can satisfy both sides. Thus, I spent my childhood in two elementary schools and later in two high schools, one of which was a music school. I also attended the Second Gymnasium Mostar, specializing in mathematics and computer science, where I had the honor of being declared the student of the generation.

Why did you choose Business Informatics?

The tendency to be interested in broad and multidisciplinary fields played a decisive role in my choice. Initially, I wanted to continue the tradition by enrolling in two different faculties, but circumstances led me to discover this program, and I decided it was exactly what I wanted. The curiosity about how the market functions and making correct decisions in a dynamic environment merged with my logical and mathematical side that enjoyed programming and data processes.

The fact that it was indeed a good choice is evident from the fact that I was offered my first job at the beginning of the final year of study. My plan was to continue my master's studies in Business Informatics, but unfortunately, this year there weren't enough applicants for it to commence. Nevertheless, my goal is to contribute to the study's image through working with students.

The first exams are coming up soon. What advice would you give to freshmen this year?

The first piece of advice I would have liked someone to give me before the first exams and, in general, before enrolling in college, is not to believe the exaggerations that older students often indulge in regarding how certain subjects are impossible to pass, how you have to give up your social life for college, etc. Everything that awaits you is not frightening at all. It's true that it requires effort and work, but regular attendance, understanding, and revising the learned material are not something that should cause so much stress. We are young.

This immediately leads to another message I would convey, which is: take care of your health. No matter how much you prioritize higher education, never put it before your well-being. Professors at the university are, from my experience, generally accommodating and understanding. Learn, but also enjoy, because they say that the student years are one of the most beautiful in life.

Throughout your education, you were an exceptionally diligent and active student with outstanding learning results. How would you encourage students to be more active in their faculties and local communities?

As much as success is a measurable indicator of effort and dedication in school and college, what potential employers, but also scholarship providers, appreciate is activism and contribution to the local community. This segment played an important role for me during my education, and it enabled me to make many new acquaintances, interact with people I wouldn't otherwise have the opportunity to befriend, help vulnerable groups, publicly advocate for citizens, and most importantly, experience happiness and a sense of fulfillment.
